Did anyone see the final episode of *Call the midwife*, the immensely popular BBC series? It was truly an emotional roller coaster, and I'm sure resulted in many a hand reaching for the tissue box! There was a range of highly emotive stories woven through the episode with a thread of mothering, caring, nurturing, and protecting. The nun in charge of St. Nonnatus House, Sister Julienne, finally got recognition for all her work. Her wisdom and experience have helped so many Poplar residents since the show began and, in a truly moving moment, she was named 'Mother of the Year' in the closing minutes of the finale. Arts commentator Fran Winston writes:

"Throughout the episode, they had been talking about 'the competition', but it had seemed merely a distracting subplot since there was so much going on. However, it all made sense at the end, as the sisters and midwives acknowledged that even though she wasn't a physical mother, she was a true mother to many."

Bible readings for this Sunday

Exodus 2: 1-10 The Birth of Moses

¹Now a man of the tribe of Levi married a Levite woman, ²and she became pregnant and gave birth to a son. When she saw that he was a fine child, she hid him for three months. ³But when she could hide him no longer, she got a papyrus basket for him and coated it with tar and pitch. Then she placed the child in it and put it among the reeds along the bank of the Nile. ⁴His sister stood at a distance to see what would happen to him.

⁵Then Pharaoh's daughter went down to the Nile to bathe, and her attendants were walking along the riverbank. She saw the basket among the reeds and sent her female slave to get it. ⁶She opened it and saw the baby. He was crying, and she felt sorry for him. "This is one of the Hebrew babies," she said.

⁷Then his sister asked Pharaoh's daughter, "Shall I go and get one of the Hebrew women to nurse the baby for you?"

8"Yes, go," she answered. So the girl went and got the baby's mother.
9Pharaoh's daughter said to her, "Take this baby and nurse him for me, and I will pay you." So the woman took the baby and nursed him.
10When the child grew older, she took him to Pharaoh's daughter and he became her son. She named him Moses, saying, "I drew him out

of the water."

Men's Breakfast



HOLY WEEK PASSOVER FEAST

Thursday March 28th from 6.00-9.00pm in St Mary's Church, Kirkby Lonsdale.



Please join us to celebrate a Messianic Passover feast this Easter in St Mary's. It explains much of the symbolism of the last supper and will help to focus us on our journey to the joy of resurrection on Easter Sunday.

The event takes the form of a "Haggadah" - telling the story of the Passover, with a feast in the middle. Jewish Passover is a family affair - children and young people are an integral part and are most welcome.

The story of the Jewish people and the story of Jesus and His followers has been told to folk of all ages wherever people met together, to keep the history alive. History spoken out loud and learned by heart-just as children have done through the centuries. Children and families are a very important part of Passover.

To plan the feast we need to know who is coming in advance so please can you let Simon Kaye know on drsakaye@gmail.com, if possible by Friday 22nd March.

We will ask people to share in the catering or if this is not possible to contribute £15 per person towards the cost. (children eat free). Any excess will be donated to St Mary's church.

At Passover we do not eat anything with yeast so please no bread, cakes with flour etc and no ham / pork.


